Garwood man sentenced to 16 year prison term

Jolious Jerome Pratt was sentenced to 16 years in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (IDTDCJ) on Dec. 21 in connection with the March 12, 1995, death of Marvin Johnson.

A Colorado County grand jury indicted Pratt, 31, of Garwood on murder charges on April 13. He pled guilty to a lesser charge of manslaughter on Nov. 27 after a jury was picked. After entering his plea, the sentencing date was set for Dec. 21 when he appeared before 25th Judicial District Judge Dwight E. Peschel.
Pratt and Johnson, 46, of Garwood, reportedly turned a heated argu-

ment into a deadly battle last March when Pratt allegedly beat Johnson to death with a claw hammer. Pratt turned himself in to the Colorado County Sheriff's Department about three and half hours after the Also, Judge Peschel sentenced Matthew Patrick Gannon, 18, of

Columbus, to 10 years in the IDTDCJ after Gannon pled guilty to charges of injury to a child. He had been indicted on April 13. The incident was discovered on March 3 when an 18-month-oldfemale was brought into the Columbus Community Hospital with a broken left femur and bruises on her face and buttocks. She was transferred to John Sealy Hospital in Galveston for surgery.
