New Medicines for Seizures

It is estimated that one in 10 persons experiences at least one epileptic seizure during his or her lifetime. Epilepsy is a neurological condition that causes sudden surges of disorganized electrical impulses in the brain. Seizures can be mild (petit mal) to severe (grand mal). The extent of involvement in the brain is the basis for classifying electrical surges into one or more seizure types. Prescription medicines are the primary method of treating seizures.

According to a report in Pharmacy Today, recent advances in the anding of seizures have been responsible for the development of new seizure medicines. Lamotrigine (Lamictal) is one of the newest. Researchers believe it works by limiting the high-frequency electrical surges. Gabapentin (Neurontin) is another effective new agent for partial seizures (those confined to small areas of the brain). It is the first seizure medicine that is not metabolized in the body, and it does not bind to protein. This is an advantage for persons who take a lot of medicines which could

According to the report, there are about 20 new drugs being evaluated world-wide for seizure control. The focus of much research is how brain injuries cause seizures and the specific role of medicines.


