Rice Raider powerlifters hold meet

Rice Raiders' Second Annual Powerlifting Championship was held at Rice High School last Saturday, Feb. 24. The meet, sponsored by the Raider Boosters, included boys and girls teams traveling from Daisetta and Goliad and ranging from Class A to 5A. It was a long and very successful day as our athletes represented us very well.

Medals were given out for the first five places in each weight division and teams trophies were given out for the top three boys teams and top girls teams. This meet was also designated as the Region 5 Regional Powerlifting Meet for girls.
