HIV Test Kits to Be Sold Texans will be the first in the U.S.

to buy home HIV test kits over the counter, following Food and Drug Administration approval last week.

In June, the 340 test kits will be available at drug stores, clinics and student health centers.

Texas was chosen over other states because of its large, culturally diverse population and high rate of infection.

Previously, HIV test were done in medical settings where those being tested were counseled before the blood was drawn.

Texas residents can call 1-800-THE-TEST and obtain the kit.
