North Lake Baptist Church May missionary lessons

Basic Theme: Women of the Bible.
First week: "Phebe", a great help to Apostle Paul. Rom. 16:1 Paul, introduces Phebe, as the bearer of his apostle, to the Romans. She was a servant of the church of "Cenchrea" Apostle Paul wrote in his letter, to the church in Jerusalem, (Rom. 16:12), "I commend unto you 'Phebe', our sister, that you receive her in the Lord, and assist her in whatsoever business she has need of you. For she has been a succor, (helper) to many, and to me also. There is no greater respect, or honor, to be acknowledged and appreciated to women, than to strive for the on going service on behalf of 'God's', ministry in the visible church.
Second week: "Martha: Home-maker." Luke 10:38-41 Martha, and her sister Mary and brother Lazarus, lived in a town called Bethany (John 11:1). Bethany was a village near the mount of Olives, which was close to the temple at Jerusalem. It was the home where Jesus made his headquarters, because they all were close friends. (Luke 10:38), tells us Jesus was received into the home of Martha, and she began making things perfect, not realizing that the master of the sea, was her guest. She kept busy making preparation for the supper. Her sister Mary's mind was captivated by the teaching of Christ Jesus. Martha became disturbed (Luke 10:41) about Mary not helping her.
Mary sat at the feet of Jesus (Luke 10:39) and heard his word. Martha and Mary were as unlike in disposition, as Esau and Jacob. Martha was so involved in material things, she failed to understand or realize the principle part of the spirituality of the second person in the God family or "God-head".
Third week: "Sapphire: Dishonest Women." Acts 5: 1-11 Acts is the history book of the New Testament. Sapphire and her husband had money to become their God. Deceit is the tragic story of Sapphire. She was a member of the church of Jerusalem. She was not forced into an agreement to sell a piece of property and give it to the church. With her husband's knowledge they kept back part of the proceeds. (1 Tim. 6:10) God stated "For the love of money is the root of all evil. (Acts 5:2) is a proof scripture that she lied, and (Psa. 101:7) God said, "A lying person, shall not tarry in sight." So God hates a liar.
