Last spring, Eula & David Wintermann Library Director Charlene Rodgers joined 125 of her colleagues from around the state taking part in the Texas State Library's Small Library Management Training Program.

The program is designed to provide and enhance basic management skills of library directors in smaller communities who have not had formal

library school coursework.

Five core courses are offered over a two and a half year period, including Administration and Planning, Collection Development, Reference Services, Cataloging and Automation, and Advanced Management Issues. Participants attend a two-day workshop each spring and fall until they have completed the entire program, and receive up to 14 hours of State-approved continuing education credit for each session they attend.

Mrs. Rodgers' active involvement in the State Library training program represents a substantial commitment of time, energy and personal expense in an effort to improve her skills as an information professional. The commitment leads directly to a better served and more informed local citizenry.

Congratulations are in order to the City of Eagle Lake for having such a dedicated professional managing the library!
