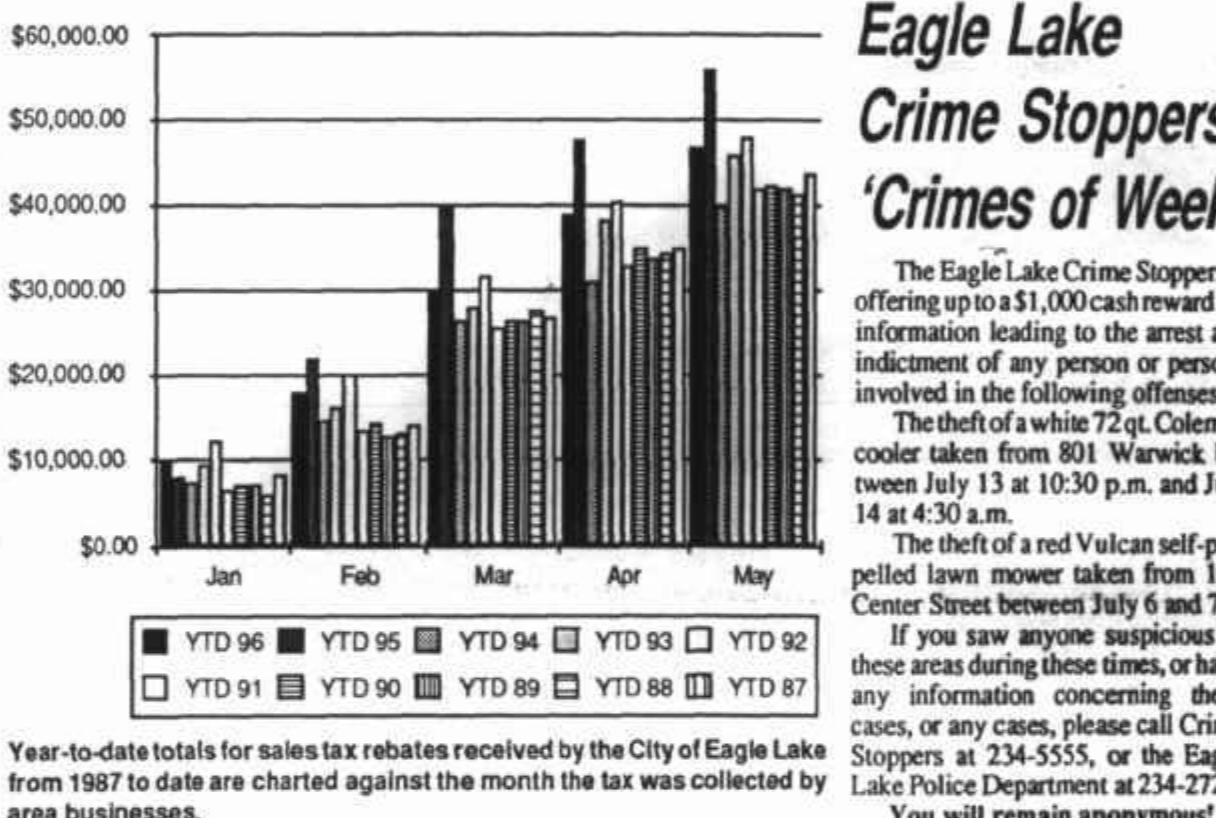

EAGLE LAKE POLICE REPORT

The Eagle Lake Police Department reported the following calls and cases for the week ending July 15.

On July 9, Officer Carl Risk served a warrant on a juvenile and took custody of the juvenile until County Deputy Richard Lacourse arrived and transported the juvenile to an appropriate facility.

Officer Brian Ochoa was dispatched to an alarm at IGA Foods on July 10, but found all secure.

On July 10, burglary of the Iglesia Bautista Getsemani was reported to Chief Keith Webb. The case was turned over to Lt. Clem Johnson who located the stolen property within two hours and identified the adult female suspect in the burglary.

The property was returned to the church and warrants have been issued for the suspect's arrest.

On July 10, Chad Webb and Lt. Johnson were dispatched to a gang fight on B Street. Several juveniles were brought to the police department in reference to the fight and later released to their parents.

Also on July 10, Lt. Johnson was dispatched to a report of an accident on East D Street. Upon arrival, Johnson observed a 1990 Chevrolet van, which had been driven by Valerie Fields of Eagle Lake, had been moved from the scene.

Investigation indicated that Fields was traveling west on C Street and failed to control speed while making a left turn onto East D Street, driving the vehicle into the northwest side of Memorial Chapel Funeral Home. There was extensive damage to the building, but there were no injuries. Citations were issued for Fields for no driver's license and failure to control speed.

On July 11, Officers Ochoa and Gary Gipson received a 911 call from B Street in reference to an assault. Tonny Clayton was later arrested for family violence, processed at the police department, then transported to the Colorado County Detention Center (CCDC) for confinement.

Officer Ochoa was dispatched to a loud music call on Church Street on July 13. The vehicle with the loud music was located and the music was turned off.

Officer David Wood and Sgt. Jack Knox were dispatched to a fight in progress at 1101 East Main on July 13. Upon arrival, the officers were gone and no other action was taken.

On July 13, Sgt. Knox made a traffic stop in the 1600 block of State Street, which resulted in the driver, Curtis Lynn Walker of Sealy, being arrested for driving while license suspended and on outstanding warrants from the DPS and Austin County Sheriff's Office. Walker was transported to CCDC for confinement.

Officer Ochoa took a report of a sexual assault of a juvenile reported on July 13. Several witnesses and one suspect were interviewed. The case is still under investigation and will be referred to the district attorney for submission to the grand jury.

Officer Brian Baklik was dispatched to Simmons Street on July 14 in reference to a theft of a Rotweiler. A report was taken and the case is under investigation.

On July 14, Officer Baklik was dispatched to L.W.'s Diamond Shamrock in reference to theft of gas. A report was taken, but the vehicle was not located.

Gott wants to pin-point weaknesses... Significant gains shown in Rice CISD TAAS scores

Efforts of teachers and administrators of the Rice Consolidated Independent School District are paying off with significant gains in most areas of the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) test as reported in a comprehensive report presented to the Board of Trustees by Superintendent
