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Lidocaine Nose Drops for Migraine Headache

The search continues for effective treatments for migraine headache, a condition that results in a great deal of suffering and costs U.S. citizens millions of dollars each year in lost work time.

Prevention: Nondrug approaches to migraine headache prevention include avoidance of factors that trigger a headache. This includes certain foods such as red wine, bright lights, and stress. There are several types of prescription medicines that may be used alone or in combination to prevent migraines.

Treatment: Medicines used to treat a migraine that is already present include the ergot-type drugs (ergotamine, methysergide, and dihydroergotamine) and a new medicine called sumatriptan (Imitrex). The newest therapy for the treatment of migraine is lidocaine, a local anesthetic medicine that has been available for decades. The drug is used as a nose drop.

In a study published recently in the *Journal of American Medical Association*, researchers evaluated persons experiencing migraine attacks. Over half of those receiving lidocaine nose drops experienced at least a 50 percent reduction in headache pain. The pain and nausea associated with migraine was relieved within 5 minutes. Persons who did not receive the nose drops did not do nearly as well.

Schulenburg squeaks by Raiders in final seconds

Schulenburg put a small damper on Parent's Night by slipping out of town with a tough-fought 34-31 win. This excitement-filled game went back and forth until the final seconds. Rice's season record is now 0-2.

Josh Godley scored on a 14-yard pass from Scott for the team's next score.
