FIXED BRIDGE

Nearly half of all adult dental patients need replacements for one or more missing teeth. A great many after 40 patients already have such replacements. While a single tooth can often be replaced by an implant substitute, the most common method is a fixed bridge.

In this situation, teeth on either side of the space are shaped so that a crown will fit over them. Impressions are then taken, from which permanent supporting base crowns of gold or non-precious metal are made. The base crowns are finally laminated with either plastic or porcelain. The permanent crowns

are soldered to the artificial teeth. The completed bridge is cemented to the supporting teeth. It is immovable.

Advantages: ease of cleaning, minimum adjustment and repair, immovability, strengthening of adjacent teeth, not to mention that beautiful feel and appearance of natural teeth. Your dentist will help you consider the factors that could affect the choice between a removable bridge or one that is fixed.
