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Exercise Caution When Using Oral Syringes

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has issued a warning to persons who administer oral liquid medicines to infants, children, and the elderly. Caregivers in the home (home care nurses and family members) should be aware of a danger that can accidentally occur when using oral syringes. Do not confuse oral syringes with syringes that are used to inject medicines into the skin or blood vessels. Some drug manufacturers supply an oral syringe with the liquid medicine that you get from the pharmacy.

A dangerous situation can occur if the small plastic syringe tip or cap falls into the medicine itself while it is being prepared. Or if the loose cap is placed into the mouth by a small child, the cap could be swallowed accidentally and the child could be in danger of choking. Observe these general guidelines when preparing and administering oral liquid medicines:

1. Always wash your hands before preparing medicine doses.
2. Remove and discard syringe caps or place them in a safe place away from the patient.
3. Withdraw the correct amount of medicine into the syringe.
4. Check the dose by holding the syringe up and reading syringe markings. Squirr excess liquid into the sink or wastebasket.

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Views On Dental Health

CURETTAGE OR SCALING

Are you a victim of a plaque attack? The villain is a sticky, colorless film of bacteria that forms on your teeth. If not removed regularly through the modern dental method of curettage or scaling, it can cause cavities and gum (periodontal or gingivitis) disease. Experts estimate that three out of every four adults are troubled with plaque accumulation at some time in life.

Dental curettage scrapes accumulated tartar and bacteria from under the gum line as well as from the surface of the tooth's root. It is this scraping that helps uplift and cleanse away tartar (hardened mineral deposits) or calculus (concrete-like mineral) from both teeth and gums.

If bacterial pockets are deep and bone loss severe, your dentist makes direct access to the infected area, and scrapes the root and gum surfaces clean. Loose teeth may be stabilized with modern treatment if caught in time. Win the battle against tooth loss with this method.
