Texas artist Boutwell at Country Peddler Show

Sometimes getting mad gives you just what you need to get up off your butt and take action.
That's what happened to Texas Artist George Boutwell in 1986 when his work was rejected by a major publisher from up north. "I got a call from this publisher who had seen one of my paintings and was really impressed and wanted to see more. I sent some samples of my work and got a call back saying the work was great but they couldn't use it because it was so obviously Texas and Texas would not sell in the national market."
To top it off, they sent me some calendars that they said had "National Appeal" and suggested that I change my approach to a more generic look. One of the calendars was titled "New England Barns" which made me real mad at the narrow minded provincial jerks and I said, "I'll show you that Texas will sell!"
George, who had been Art Director of Texas Highways Magazine for six years before going full time as a watercolor artist, knew how popular Texas was, so he decided to publish and sell his own Texas calendar.
George Boutwell's anger coupled with his love of Texas turned out to be the driving force that caused his career to sky-rocket and now he publishes an annual Texas calendar, complete with 12 of his paintings. The only calendar we know of that lists the official Texas holidays.
In addition, George now has a 32-page catalog called George Boutwell's Texas Collection which shows his limited edition prints as well as note, greetings and post cards and gift items that reflect what George calls the "Real Texas" and not the phony stuff you see in the movies and on national television! George Boutwell's 1997 Calendar will feature Texas country churches!

Today, George says, "I'm not mad at those Yankees any more because if they hadn't been so dumb, my career wouldn't have come this far!"
George travels all over Texas every year to art shows that range from exclusive one-man-shows to some of the better festivals and does a lot of exploring. "I love running the back roads and observing the everyday things that you never see from the freeway."
In addition to inspiration from his travels, George gathers lots of inspiration from the ranch in rural Bosque County near Clifton that he and his wife, Martha, call home.
Viewing one of George's shows is like taking a tour of Texas because of the variety of subjects he paints.
George found the same foolish ideas that Texas wouldn't sell in most of the stores he contacted about selling his calendar, so he decided to do his own marketing.
I guess the buyers for the stores go to the markets where the generic stuff is promoted and are afraid of taking a chance, so they all buy the same things to sell."
George started showing his calendar at his art shows and the orders came in like a landslide.
"We now have thousands of people who have standing orders for the calendar each year, but we have very few stores that are willing to sell our calendar."
