Brahmas bull their way past Raiders

Rice traveled to Bellville last Friday to take on the Brahmas and came away with a 35-18 loss which brings their record to 0-7 for the season.

Offensively, the Raiders came to life after a long, dry spell and scored three touchdowns.

Kendrick Pipkins had 72 yards on 12 carries and scored one TD on a three-yard run.

Pete Rangel scored Rice's other two TDs on runs of 15 and six yards.

The Raiders had 148 yards rushing and 38 yards in the air for a total of 186

offensive yards.

"Our blocking and running was much better last week," said Coach Dennis Jackson. "We plan on doing much better this week."

Defensively, the team did a pretty good job for the most part. A few plays here and there would have made the game much closer than it was, according to Jackson. They must execute their responsibilities and tackle a lot better, he added.

Bellville gained 247 yards on the ground and 19 in the air for a total of

266 yards of offense.

Pete Rangel placed second in the varsity boys division and will advance to the Region III Cross Country meet at San Jacinto College in Pasadena on Saturday, Nov. 2.

Rangel's second place time was 18:11. Jimmy Hassin placed 14th with a time of 23:49.

Rebal Canaris won the JV girls division with a time of 15:19. Canaris finished well ahead of the second place finisher and was not pushed at all during the entire race.

Nikki Chamberlain placed 15th in varsity girls with a time of 15:40.

The Raiders JV boys team once again completely dominated their opposition as they won the 22-3A JV

Title, finishing the season at 5-2.

The Raiders outpointed second place La Grange 16 to 42.

Leading the way to victory and earning individual medals were Jose Ruiz (2nd, 20:18); Emmanuel Zarate (3rd, 20:34); and Joey Sommerlatte (4th, 20:50).

try to education by using lottery revenue to fund a new college scholarship program.

Supporters of the plan said about 80,000 high school students could initially qualify for the \$1,000-a-year scholarships if they graduate with at least a B average in recommended courses and attend a public college or university.

The proposal, which must be approved by the Legislature, would cost about \$80 million in its first year and \$160 million in the second year. The lottery generates about \$1.1 billion a year for the state treasury.

Board member Jose Garcia De Lara of San Antonio drafted the proposal, emphasizing that it would address the demands of many Texans that some lottery money be earmarked for education.

"The perception is that the lottery was intended to go to education," De Lara told the *Dallas Morning News*. "Quite frankly, the people are angry in

In that match, Nikki Chamberlain, Bridget Baird, Coco Johnson, Terri Shropshire and Christie Cranek all scored on spikes and spike kills.

Points were also scored off strong serving games by Rachelle Kallina, Risa Waddell, Andrea Machac and Adriana Cordova.

The defense did an excellent job with strong passing performances turned in by Machac at 83% accuracy; Chamberlain, 82%; Cordova, 82%; Cranek, 79%; and Kallina, 80%.

Hempstead came to Rice on Saturday, Oct. 12, and was soundly defeated by the Lady Raiders, 15-6; 15-7.

Again, strong spiking performances were turned in by Chamberlain with three kills, while Baird, Cranek and Shropshire each had two. Johnson contributed one kill.
