Halloween night proved to be a fright for the Rice JV Raiders as the Hempstead Bobcats scared up a win by the score 42-29.

Scoring for Rice was Jonathan Godley with a 70-yard kick-off return. Kevin Hoffman kicked the extra point.

Godley also had a 54-yard run and ran in the two-point conversion as well.

Barrett Thomas caught a 57 yard pass from Jose Ruiz. The point after attempt failed.

Jose Ruiz had a one-yard run, while Scott Bittner ran in the conversion.

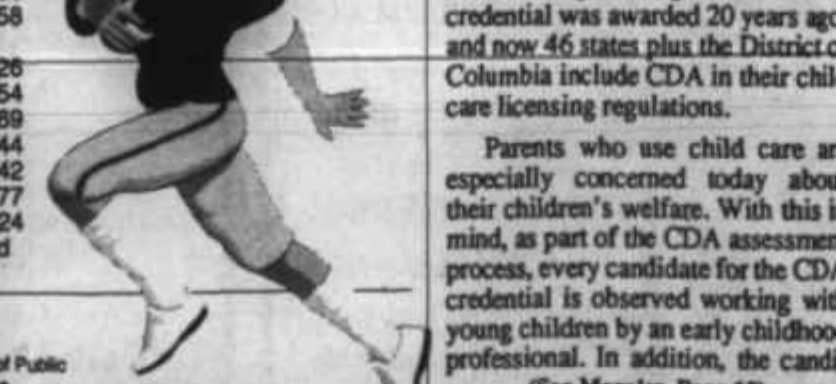
Texas high school students play hard
