What to Do About Sleep Problems

Approximately 15 percent of Americans suffer from insomnia, an inability to fall asleep or stay asleep. Among the elderly, chronic sleep problems are even more widespread. Some researchers estimate that up to 50 percent of older persons are affected by some type of sleeping disorder.

Non-drug approaches to insomnia have proven beneficial in certain instances. (1) Keep yourself physically fit. A healthy body tends to sleep better than one that is not healthy. (2) Go to bed only when you are tired or sleepy. Read or try a light snack such as warm milk if you are not sleepy at your normal bedtime. (3) During the evening avoid alcohol, tea, coffee, chocolate, and soft drinks that contain caffeine. (4) Try to awaken and get out of bed at about the same time each day.

Nonprescription sleep medicines which contain diphenhydramine and doxylamine are safe and often effective. The 1983 Consensus Conference on Drugs and Insomnia recommended that prescription sleep medicines only be used in short-term situations. The family of prescription sleep medicines used most frequently include flurazepam, triazolam, and estazolam. Prescription antidepressant medicines may help relieve insomnia if depression also is present.

SHOES SHOULD FIT THE JOB

If your job depends on your feet, proper foot care should be one of your top priorities. Of all the serious foot injuries that occur at work, three out of four could have been prevented by wearing appropriate safety footwear, reports the National Safety Council. Of course, different jobs call for different types of protection. Any occupation that involves walking on wet, oily surfaces calls for shoes with non-slip soles made of wood, rubber, or neoprene, or fitted with cleats. Anyone working around high voltages should wear shoes with rubber or cork bottoms and no exposed metal parts. If chemicals or solvents are used on site, footwear should be made of rubber, vinyl, or other plastic, with synthetic stitching.

Buying the right shoes is an important part of foot care. Considering how much our feet do for us, the least we can do is provide preventive care before a problem occurs and professional care when and if they do. Whether it means a change of foot wear or a more medical approach, there's help for your feet, and lots you can do to make sure your feet stand up to years of wear and tear. One good step is a call to 234-5571, at Rice District Community Hospital. I am there every Tuesday.
