Physicians Increase Use of OTC Medicines

The purchase and use of nonprescription or over-the-counter (OTC) medicines by Americans is increasing. Two major reasons are (1) increasing approvals by the U.S. government of medicines that were once available by prescription only, and (2) an increasing willingness by physicians to prescribe OTC medicines.

A survey reported in *Medical Marketing and Media* indicates that more than 40 percent of physicians had recommended OTC products for their patients in the past 12 months. A recent report in *American Health Line* describes a study of 29,000 patients in southern California. Physicians were asked by the sponsoring organization to substitute OTC products for prescription medicines when possible. Substitution of OTCs resulted in a reported savings of over \$15,000 during a six-month period.

More physicians are recommending OTCs today because more products are available. In 1995 the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved the switching of six prescription drugs to OTC status. Medicines switched include ranitidine (Zantac 75), butocinaclone (Femstat 3), famotidine (Pepcid AC), ibuprofen (Children's Motrin), cimetidine (Tagamet HB), and ketoprofen (Orudis KT and Actron).
