Senate puts 'teeth' in zero tolerance law

The Texas Senate passed a bill that puts teeth in a 1995 "zero tolerance" law designed to rid public school campuses of drugs, alcohol and violent and disruptive students while guaranteeing due process.





Extensive, uncontrolled bleeding surgery is neither serious nor abnorfrom the gums or other mouth tissue is a serious dental emergency. If you can't get in touch with a dentist, call your physician, or go to a hospital emergency room If you have had bleeding problems

previously, or if you have diabetes or high blood pressure, or if you are taking medication, be sure to tell your dentist BEFORE any surgery. Then he or she can decide what precautions to take, and whether to go ahead with the sur-

mal. Until you can get in touch with your dentist, apply a small square of gauze to the area and bite or press down on it for about half an hour. If this doesn't work, try biting on a wet teabag for a while. The tannic acid usually stops bleeding. Also, you can rinse with a 2% solution of hydrogen peroxide for three minutes. Still bleeding? See your dentist.
