COLORADO COUNTY COURTHOUSE REPORT



DISTRICT COURT JURY TRIAL

Derrick O'Neil Stevens was found guilty of assault on a peace officer by a jury on March 25.

Stevens, who had been indicted for assaulting Eagle Lake Police Lt. Clem Johnson and Officer Carl Risk on 10-9-95, elected for sentencing by the judge rather than a jury. That sentencing will take place on May 1.

Jose Daniel Navarro, aggravated sexual assault; occurred 10-28-95. Incarcerated in the Institutional Division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) from 10-2-96 until placed on 8 years probation on 3-20-97. Sentenced 3-20-97 to 3 years deferred adjudication, 340 hours community service; pay \$1,000 fine, \$640 restitution, court costs. William Powell, burglary of a building; occurred 12-7-95. Sentenced 3-20-97 to 5 years deferred adjudication, 340 hours community service; pay \$1,000 fine, \$150 restitution, court costs.

DeAndrian LaTroy Dentley, burglary of a habitation; occurred 6-30-96. Sentenced to 5 years deferred adjudication on 11-2-95. Punishment revoked 3-20-97 and sentenced to 12 years in the Institutional Division of the TDCJ.

Additional charge of burglary of a habitation occurring 10-8-96 resulted in another 12 year sentence in the Institutional Division of the TDCJ. The terms will run concurrent.
