

One in six American women have some form of SUI. \$18 billion was spent on all forms of adult diaper products last year alone.

Instead of treating the symptom by wearing pads and avoiding activities, a woman should seek diagnosis of the type of incontinence she may be experiencing. There is stress incontinence, urge incontinence and neurogenic incontinence. A woman can experience more than one type at the same time.
