

#### **Aspirin Now Shown to Benefit Women**

For at least 20 years, medical researchers have known that aspirin keeps the body from forming blood clots. Research has shown that aspirin blocks the production of substances called prostaglandins. This effect helps keep platelets in the blood from sticking or clumping together. The net effect is to keep the blood flowing smoothly. The overall risk of heart attack and stroke is reduced, and so is the risk of death from clot formation. Some physicians prescribe aspirin in small doses (75 milligrams per day) in persons who have already had a heart attack. However, daily doses of aspirin generally are not recommended for persons who are otherwise

Studies on the protective effect of low doses of aspirin against blood clots have been conducted almost exclusively in men. Recently researchers questioned if the same protective effect would be available to women as well. They evaluated over 2,400 women with ischemic heart disease (narrowed blood vessels going to the heart). Almost half of the women were taking aspirin. The results are not conclusive, but are encouraging. During an average follow-up of 3 years, women with heart disease who took aspirin had a heart-related death rate of 2.7%. Women not taking aspirin experienced a heart-related death rate of over 5%.
