

# Psencik, Black united in holy matrimony

The back yard at the home of Mr. and Mrs. John Psencik was beautifully decorated with white lattice work, ferns and a cage of live doves for the setting of the marriage of their daughter, Tamra Ann Psencik and Harold Dwayne Black.

The wedding, held at 5 p.m. Saturday, April 19, 1997, was officiated by Brother Del Sanford of Sheridan.

Witnesses to the marriage were Mr. and Mrs. Felix Psencik of San Antonio.

Tamra is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Psencik of Eagle Lake. She is the granddaughter of Mrs. Christine of Cistern and the late Felix Psencik and Mrs. Pauline Dudley of Purdin, Missouri, and the late Standly Murrain.

After the opening prayer, the groom sang "As Long As I Live" to the bride. The bride had this song title engraved inside the wedding band of the groom.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a formal gown of white silk Shantung and Alencon lace designed by Impressions Bridal, fashioned with a modified off-the-shoulder V-neck dipping to a V'd back. 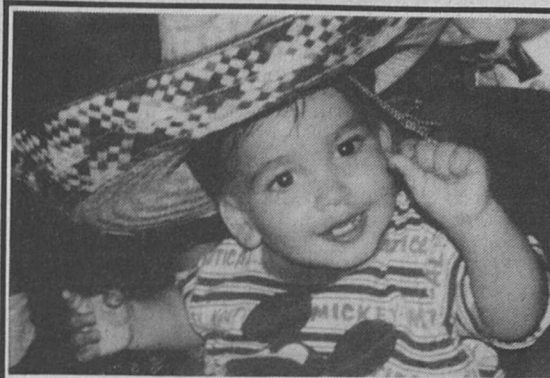
The couple received many nice gifts and good wishes for the future.
