### DISPOSITIONS

## CCEMS schedules ECA course in Sheridan

Colorado County Emergency Medical Services (CCEMS) is sponsoring an Emergency Care Attendant (ECA) course to be held at the Community Center in Sheridan beginning June 3 and finishing Aug. 4. Classes will meet from 6 to 10 pm.

ECA certification is the first level of Texas Department of Health certification for ambulance attendants.

Rural volunteer ambulance organizations are usually in need of more personnel and Colorado County is no exception.

If you are interested in taking the course, you should call EMS Director Marc Jordan at 409-732-9635 or TDH Coordinator June Mahalic at 409-234-2678 as soon as possible.

"The course will be limited to 20 students on a first come, first serve basis since time is needed to order books early enough to make them available for the first class," said Mahalic.

The ECA course will also fill re-

quirements for EMTs who need continuing education hours for their 2-year 40-hour requirement or for those who need additional hours to complete their 80-hour requirement for recertification.

These people will need to participate in the class and take exams covering material for which they attend.

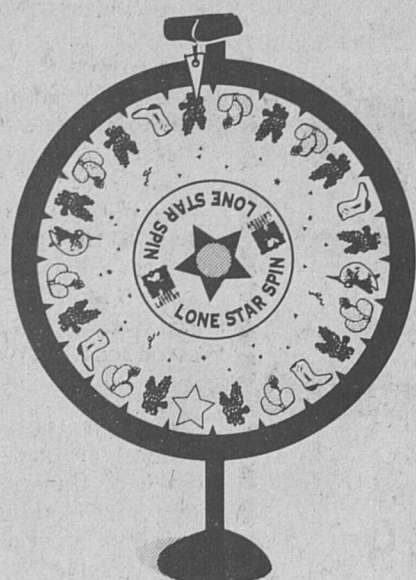
