## Museum to honor area post offices

Prairie Edge Museum in Eagle Lake plans an exhibit honoring local communities no longer having post offices.

According to Curators William H. Harrison Sr. and Rollin H. Baker, there are several former population centers which had their own post offices but are currently served by rural mail carrier routes out of either Columbus, Eagle Lake, Garwood or Weimar.

The names of some of these communities, formerly having post offices, are still well-known today including Alleyton, Borden, Bernardo, Chesterville, Matthews, Provident City, Ramsey and Vox Populi.

Others remain in the dimly-lit past like Calhoun, Cheatham, Eldridge, Hillebrand, Osage and Pisek.

To make the display meaningful, Prairie Edge Museum needs stamped envelopes mailed at these former post offices.

These envelopes should bear cancellation marks showing clearly the names of the post offices.

Citizens are asked to dig among their keepsakes for letters having such cancellations relics of our county's past to supply this educational need.

The Museum promises to take good care of such items, if they are donated or loaned.

SIZING UP FOOT PROBLEMS

In the realm of fairy tales and cartoons, a character tromping around with mismatched legs or one over-sized foot can seem comical. When the feet or legs aren't the same size in real life, however, the problems can be anything but funny. The truth is, many people go through life with feet of slightly different sizes without ever being aware of it. Such differences are usually measured in small fractions of an inch. When the disparity is substantially larger, the main trouble may be in finding shoes to fit both feet. Athletic shoes with laces are sometimes flexible enough to be adjusted to accommodate the disparity, but custom-made footwear may be recommended to keep the feet — and entire body — in balance. If one leg is at least an inch longer than the other, prescription orthotics (shoe inserts) may solve the foot, leg, or back problems that can result.
