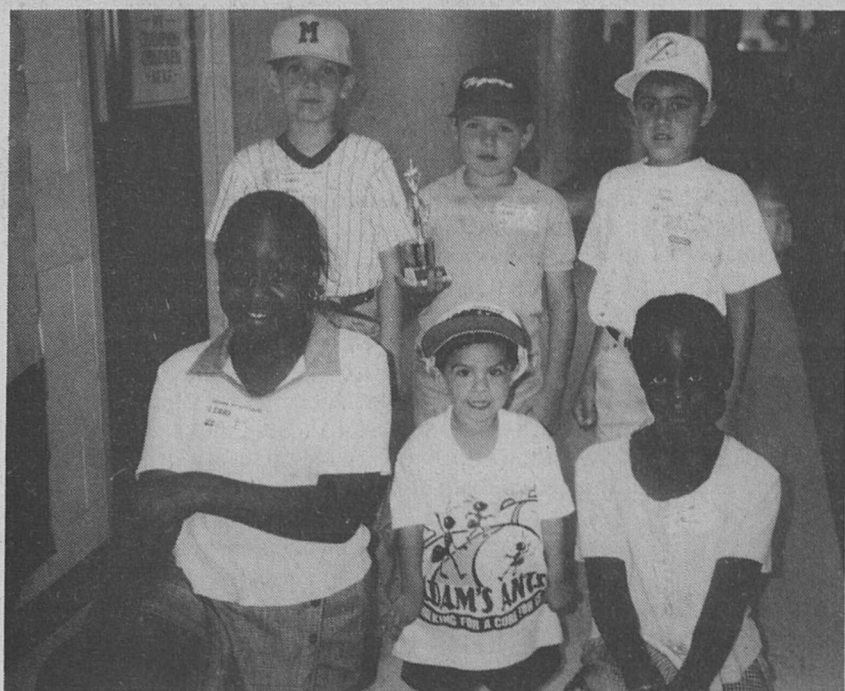


When the stars come out

Hawn, along with Kurt Russell who was there to lend moral support, were in Richmond recently.

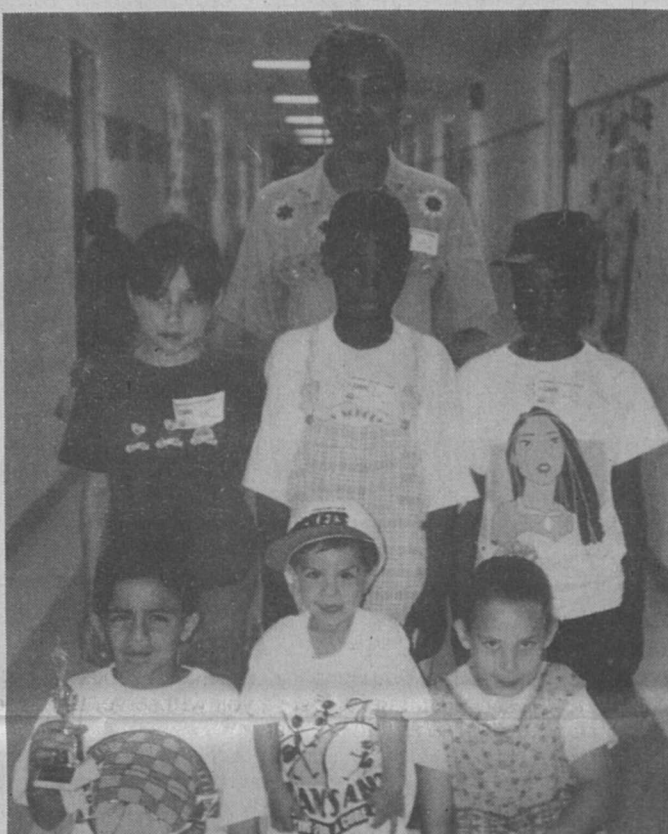

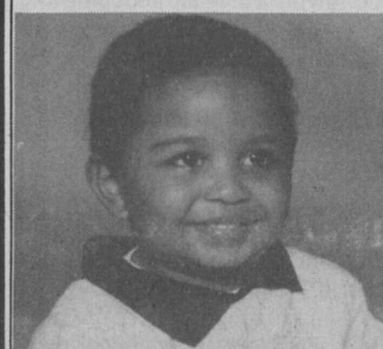

ORAL & MAXILLOFACIAL SURGEON?

Admittedly, "maxillofacial" is a mouthful. In simplest terms, it refers to that part of the face consisting of the "maxilla", or upper jaw, and cheek bones, on down past the lower jaw, including the jaw joint. Oral and maxillofacial surgery (oral surgery) then includes the diagnosis and surgical treatment of injuries, diseases, and malformations of the mouth and jaws.

Many routine oral surgical procedures may be managed by the family dentist. However, both dentists and physicians refer a wide variety of problems to the oral surgeon. These are

services which need a specialist. Examples include the treatment of cysts, tumors, infections and lesions of the mouth and jaws, as well as the need to remove infected and impacted teeth.

Other more complex problems include jaw and facial fractures; the surgical contouring of the mouth for a better denture foundation; and surgical orthodontic procedures.

employees who retire from the district. The leave will be paid only for days accrued while the employee was employed by the Rice District.

Payment will be disbursed for 60 days of accumulated leave. Any unused days beyond 60 will be forfeited. The policy will be in effect beginning with the past school year retirees.

The committees appointed were:

•Budget: Jack Vawter, chairman, Madison Smith, Robin Thomas;

•Salary & benefits: Smith, chairman, Laurel Milentz, Clark Powers;

•Facilities: Milentz, chairperson, Jim Wiese and Powers; and

•Curriculum & instruction: Thomas, chairperson, Fritz Leopold and Vawter.

Vawter, Board president, presented a Commissioner of Education's Certificate of Recognized Performance to Sheridan School which was accepted by Principal Larry Varley.

The Board also discussed the Vox Populi Alternative School in regard to purchase or continuation of its lease. Urgent improvements are needed on the water well, septic system and drainage.

Asst. Superintendent Fred Grahmann told the Board it would be more advantageous to the District to own the property, therefore, the Board voted to obtain a licensed appraiser to examine the property and determine an initial purchase offer.

"It is our long-term plan to keep Vox Populi. It is working," said Superintendent Dr. Richard Gott.

In other business, the Board:

•Approved a new dryer for the ELMS dressing room costing \$2,100;

•Approved a proposal by David Schmidt to level and drain the existing baseball field in the amount of \$1,860;

•Approved seal coating for the administration parking lot, driveway to the back of the administration building, faculty parking lot and driveway to the vocational ag shop and striping of both parking lots at RHS by American Services at a cost of \$4,200; and

•Approved a \$41,350 bid from Courts-N-Stuff for concrete overlay on two tennis courts with post-tension concrete and acrylic paint and stripe on four courts at the RHS campus.

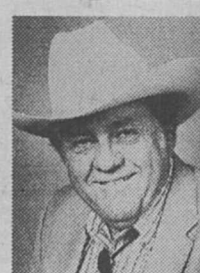

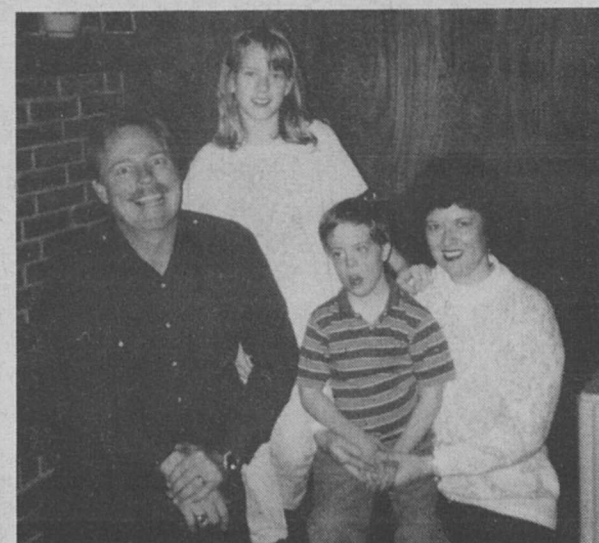

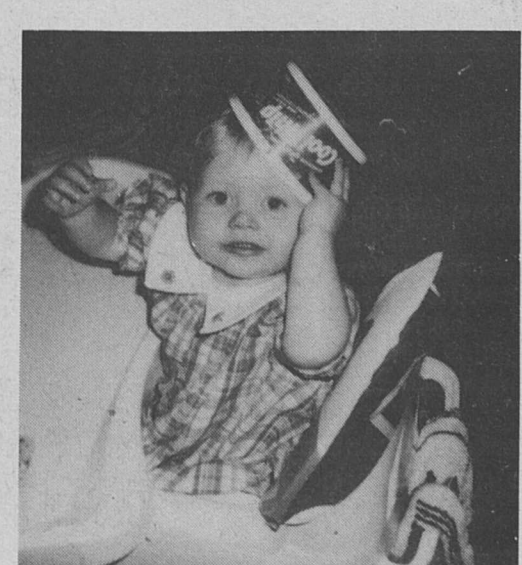
