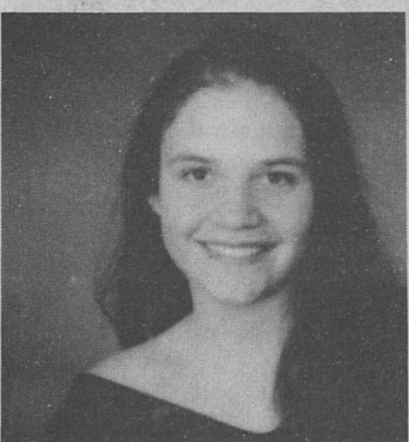
Jessica Briscoe receives KJZT scholarship

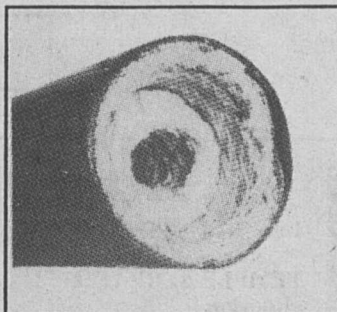

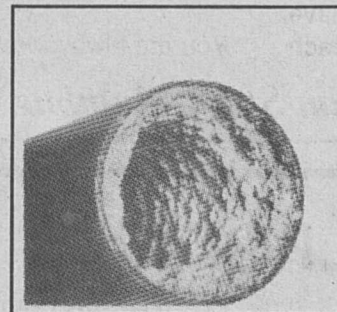

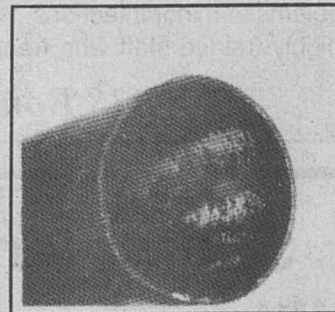
