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Medicine Approved for Osteoporosis Prevention

Recently, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved alendronate (Fosamax) for the prevention of osteoporosis, a condition in which the bones become porous and subject to fracture. Osteoporosis affects an estimated 25 million Americans, including half of all women in the U.S. over age 45 and approximately 90 percent of women over age 75. Alendronate was originally approved in 1995 for the treatment of osteoporosis. The good news about alendronate for osteoporosis prevention, is that it provides an alternative to estrogen replacement, a therapy that some women do not want to take to lower fracture risk.

In a six-year international study involving over 1,600 women, it was determined that alendronate was considered safe and effective in preventing loss of bone in postmenopausal women. The dose used to prevent osteoporosis is 5 milligrams daily, one-half the amount used to treat the condition. In clinical trials, women who took 5 mg daily experienced better than a 45 percent reduction in risk of fracture of the hip, spine, and forearm.

Alendronate should be taken on an empty stomach with a full glass of water. To prevent irritation of the esophagus, one should not lie down for at least 30 minutes after taking a dose.

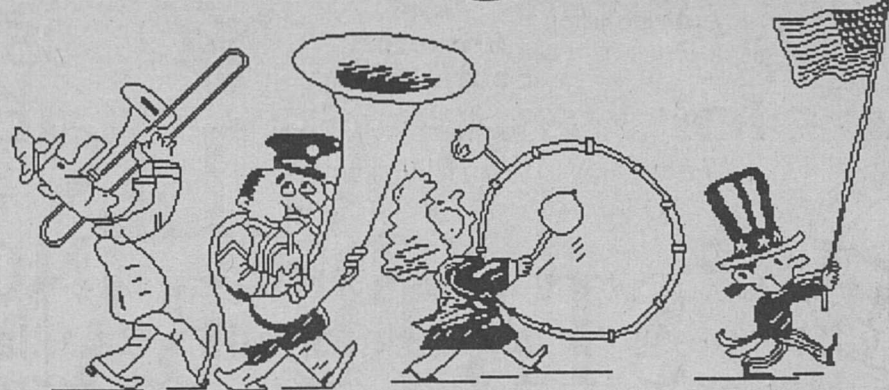
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
