We will be prosecuting all criminal cases in County, District and Justice Courts in Colorado County. We expect that the consolidation of these efforts will assist law enforcement and expedite the administration of justice in many ways.

This will all take effect Sept. 1, 1997.

I am working hard with my staff to obtain necessary equipment, additional personnel and acquire the training required to be able to handle this job effectively from the first day.

Many may be wondering what effect this is going to have on the county budget. Little, if any is the simple answer.

The State will now be paying my salary and benefits which will free up some money to pay other staff members.

Also, Colorado County for 1997 had budgeted \$34,325 for the D.A., this money is now available to be used for local felony prosecutions. In addition the discretionary "hot check" funds, and the State supplement, which HB 3572 gives the C.A. to operate with, should be able to make

ends meet initially.

We feel that this change will be a great benefit to the people of Colorado County for many years to come. We will continue our "open door" policy toward the public. Our thanks to everyone who worked, hoped and prayed for the passage of this bill. We will endeavor to do our best to live up to your confidence in this office.
