trying to avoid using taxpayers' money and putting the cost where it ought to be."

"It is my personal belief that the security is needed. With this scenario, it provides the security on short notice," said Precinct 1 Commissioner Richard Seifert, who made the motion to contract with the County Attorney's office. "At the same time, this individual will do some work in that office. I think it is worth a try on a trial basis. It is a reasonable way to use it (funds)."

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Youens told Council the annual cost of the new building will be \$33,822, plus another \$10,000 for janitorial, electric and insurance, a total of \$43,822.

This amount increases the annual contribution of the 10 contributing entities by \$22,534. Eagle Lake's increase will be approximately \$600.

The present rent payment will go a long way in debt repayment, according to Youens.

The CAD has been housed in the Courthouse for 18 years. Youens also visited with Council concerning the elimination of property tax on vehicles.

According to Youens, the change would drop Eagle Lake's tax base from \$62,400,132 to \$57,153,462. The tax rate would increase by about 5¢ per \$100 valuation to generate the same revenue.

People would pay slightly higher taxes on real estate, but would not pay any property tax on vehicles, he said.

"Elimination of vehicle tax will eliminate a lot of delinquent accounts because most delinquent accounts are not reported or even put on the tax rolls," said Youens.

Youens told Council that 89% of Eagle Lake property tax was paid in 1996 as compared to 75% of automobile accounts. Delinquent auto accounts total 1,350 for Eagle Lake.

According to Youens, six entities in Colorado County, City of Dallas and Medina County are the only ones in the state of Texas still taxing vehicles.

The City of Columbus does not tax autos.

Council will review the subject and hold a public hearing before a decision is reached.

In other business, Council:
• Approved an interlocal co-operation contract with The Texas Department of Public Safety to allow the Eagle Lake Police Department to purchase certain items;

• Discussed the truck permit ordinance in reference to damage to Glen Flora Road, as the present ordinance presently allows for loaded trailers not permitted to park on other city streets; and

• Heard a report on loose dogs as City Manager Ron Holland referred to a directive given Eagle Lake Police Chief Keith Webb, to "burst the budget to get rid of some of these dogs".

The Court also set a public hearing for Aug. 20 at 7 p.m. to consider the automobile tax deletion, and also discuss the septic system and floodplain management position currently being filled by County Judge Vince Slominski's secretary, Susan Rogers.

"We hope to repeal the tax on some personal property, specifically automobiles. This comes on the heels of higher oil and gas appraisals and I think we have the right opportunity to give a tax break to those citizens," said Slominski.

Colorado County is one of the last counties in the entire state that continues to tax automobiles.

In other business, the Court:
• Renewed its annual agreement with the state attorney general's office in regard to child support payments;

• Appointed election judges for 1997-98 and then named the election judges for the Aug. 9 special election with the pay scale being \$5.25 per hour, beginning Sept. 1;

• Authorized the advertisement for EMS volunteer blanket accident insurance and disability income for its volunteers;

• Tabled a contract on an airport hanger lease agreement with Jim Otto and resolution of support for the City of Columbus' MidTown Park project until more information is available;

• Amended its resolution, adopted on Feb. 27, that if grant funds, totaling

\$2,500, are not used on the Juvenile Services Program as outlined, that they will be returned; and

• Approved Hoelscher Oil Co. and Colorado County Oil Co., both of Columbus, and Thomas Petroleum of Victoria as the recipients of the fuel bids for the precincts and sheriff's department.
