Her maternal grandparents are Buck and Barbara Watson of Eagle Lake. Paternal grandparents are Lawrence and Agnes Labay of Nada.

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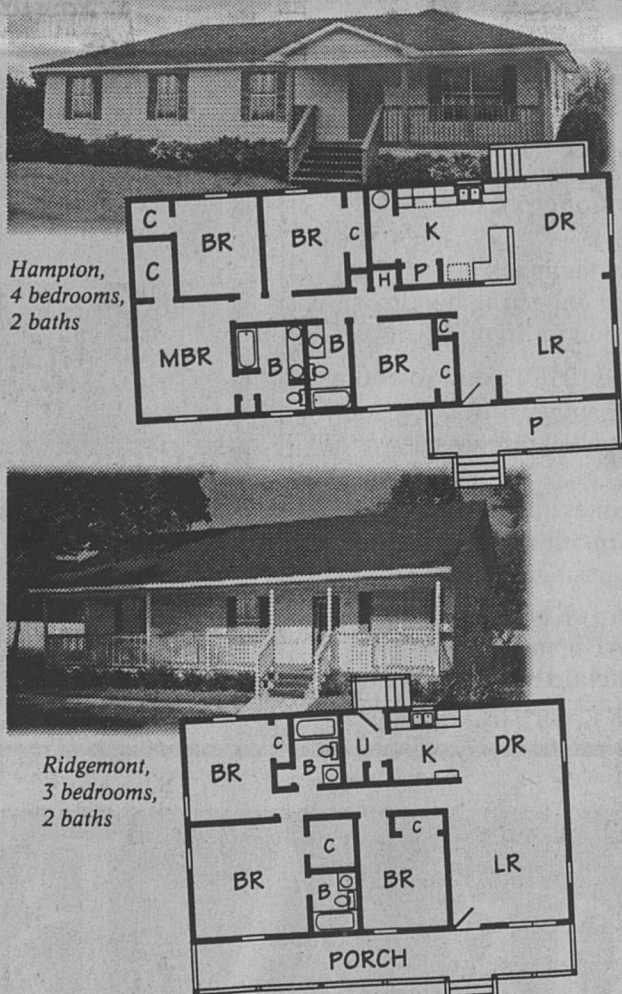
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NIGHTINGALE'S CORNER

Oh, my aching neck!!

Keyboard operators, draftsmen, truck drivers and many others in jobs that require sitting all day long, are guilty of blithely carrying out those lessons we learned as school children. We sit or stand in one position all day long, restricting our movements and causing stiffness and pain in all our joints, muscles and ligaments.

The obvious result of this is often astiff, sore neck and aching shoulders.

Many people experience head, neck and back pain simply because they hold their neck in one position all

day.

Muscles that are not moved regularly tighten and shorten, then they become tired under the constant strain. The muscles of your head, neck and back are very vulnerable to stiffness and pain due to the hard work of holding up your head. They are being used all day long. This can eventually lead to severe muscle tension headaches.

There are several things you can do to avoid those pains in your head, neck and shoulders.

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HELP FOR THE THUMB SUCKER

Most infants and young children suck their thumbs occasionally. It usually occurs at bedtime or when the child is bored. Normally, this habit is broken by itself by age four or five.

Unfortunately, teeth can't tell the difference between the planned pressure exerted by orthodontic braces and that from a child's thumb. Thumbsuckers can change the position of their teeth (often resulting in overbite or "buck" teeth) if they continue the habit after permanent teeth come in.

What can be done to break the thumbsucking habit? Probably not much until the child is ready and able to

cooperate. For the child whose thumbsucking fills an emotional need, attempts to break the habit could trigger frustration and resentment.

For the child who WANTS to stop but can't do it alone, mittens, thumbguards, bitter medication on the thumbnail or certain wire appliances can help. Treatment should be individually tailored to the child. No rigid rules apply to all children.
