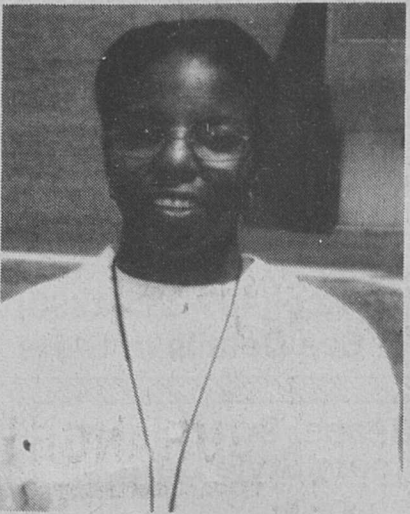

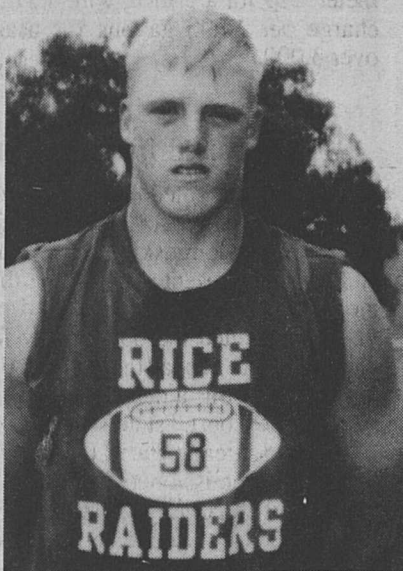
wonder, "Who's that teacher?" One bright, smiling face you surely can't miss is that of coach and teacher, Tammy Henry.

Joe Romo and Tim Galvan looked down with a frown when they guessed Brooke Cranek.

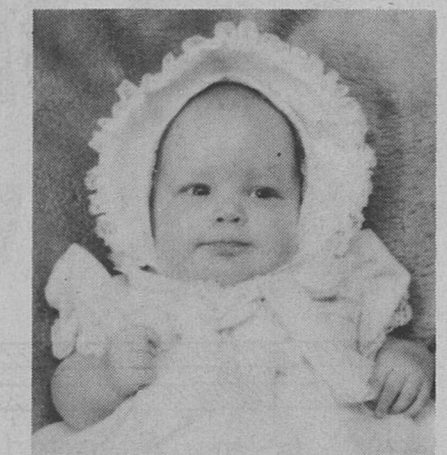
Arelli Arellano was stunned when she guessed Tiffany Wilkerson.
