## Foot Facts

### DIAGNOSING A SPRAINED ANKLE

The second it happens, you know - or at least you THINK you know. A sprained ankle is usually marked by a sharp pain, followed by the feeling that the foot will no longer bear weight. However, an accurate diagnosis of a sprained ankle goes far beyond those "feelings". Because the nature of the sprain may effect the kind of treatment necessary, a podiatrist may recommend some type of imaging testing. The most common of these are X-rays, which can confirm or rule out the presence of any fractures, dislocations, or joint instabilities. Testing to identify any soft-tissue damage may also be advised, via such means as computerized tomography (CT) or magnetic resonance imaging (MRI).

Pain is often the first sign of a foot or ankle injury, but pain doesn't always reveal the cause of an injury. The best way to determine the exact cause, location, and seriousness of an injury is to have a podiatric evaluation including medical history, examination, and tests. And, complete instructions for follow-up care and prevention are also an integral part of any treatment plan we formulate. 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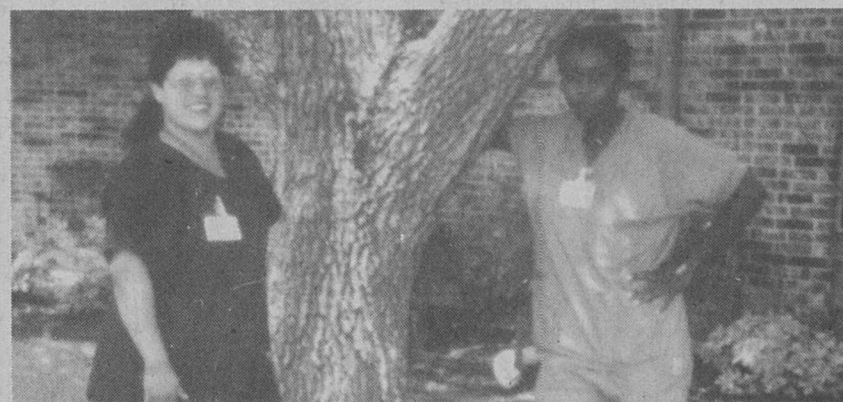
