Foot Facts

IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF DIABETES
Diabetes is a disease in which the body's metabolism of sugar goes haywire. On the surface, it is a condition that might seem far removed from the health and welfare of the feet. In fact, the feet are often the first indicators of diabetes, particularly in older patients. The disease may initially appear as breaks or ulcers in the skin of the feet, typically on the balls of the foot or near neglected corns, calluses, or toenails. Other early foot symptoms may include numbness and infections that don't heal. Once diabetes has been diagnosed, regular care by a podiatrist is a must. This should include trimming of toenails, treatment of any corns or calluses, and immediate attention for any abnormality.
If you have diabetes, you probably already know that you face special health challenges as the result of the disease. Slow healing due to poor circulation in the feet may increase the risk of infection, and damaged nerves can impair the sensations that make it possible to feel the pain that signals an injury. Don't take chances with your health. Seek professional help for treatment as well as prevention. Foot problems of all kinds are always welcome here at Rice Medical Center (234-5571).
