Meanwhile, a Senate Interim Subcommittee on Sex Offenders is conducting hearings on a proposal that would put Texas' worse sex offenders into treatment programs.

Subcommittee chair Florence Shapiro, R-Plano, said, "We must put into place a new system with which to protect the public."

Such a program may cost dearly. A Washington state program to treat sexual predators costs about \$68,000 per person a year.

UPGRADE EMS: As a deputy sheriff, I learned how important our EMS is to all of us. The present County government has made great strides in upgrading our EMS service at minimal cost. I would like to continue improving our EMS service.
