New Guidelines: Blood Pressure Treatment

In 1972 the National Institutes of Health, a U.S. governmental agency, established the National High Blood Pressure Education Program. One of the efforts of this program is to provide guidelines for the treatment of hypertension (high blood pressure). Treatment guidelines have been published for several years as reports of the Joint National Committee or the JNC. In 1992 the fifth report of the JNC (called JNC-V) recommended the use of two types of medicines as primary treatments for high blood pressure—(1) diuretics such as hydrochlorothiazide (Esidrix), and (2) beta blockers such as metoprolol (Lopressor) atenolol (Tenormin) and nadolol (Corgard). The report was controversial in that it did not list other first-prescribed agents such as the calcium channel blockers and ACE inhibitors.

The latest report from the Joint National Committee, JNC-VI, was released a few months ago. The new report again recommended diuretics and beta blockers as "first-prescribed" blood pressure medicines. However, ACE inhibitors such as enalapril (Vasotec) were recommended for persons with diabetes or heart failure. The long-acting calcium channel blockers such as nifedipine (Procardia XL) were recommended as an option for older persons who have isolated systolic high blood pressure.
