

About a third of the proposed charters are for existing private and or religious schools that want to become publicly financed charter schools, and the remainder would be new schools, The Dallas Morning News reported.

Brooks Flemister, state director for charter schools with the Texas Education Agency, said State Board of Education members can select as many of the 83 proposed charter schools as they wish.

"They can approve all 83 or none, whatever they want to do," Flemister said, referring to the charter school law passed by the Legislature last year. Lawmakers authorized up to 100 new "open enrollment" charter schools in the state, leaving it up to the board to grant the charters.

Such charter schools are publicly financed, exempt from most state regulation such as class-size limits, and accept students regardless of where they live.
