U.S. Hwy. 90 and FM 806 in Columbus.

The CAD was given a fall 1998 moving date from the Courthouse by Colorado County Commissioners' Court.

Youens is projecting the building can be completed by this fall if six of the seven governing voting entities it serves lends their support to the project in a timely manner.

The cities of Columbus, Eagle Lake and Weimar and Commissioners' Court have already voted to support the CAD's resolution. Since the Rice CISD voted 'yes', Youens needs only one more yes vote when he approaches the Weimar and Columbus school districts next week.

Garwood Water, Glidden Water and the Rice Hospital Districts do not vote.

The District received an independent appraisal totaling \$140,000 on the IGA building in Eagle Lake.

It also was determined that the building contains asbestos and removal of the substance will drive the cost higher than previously quoted for the property (being considered for the school district's alternative center).

The owner is asking for \$135,000, plus the cost of the asbestos removal.

The Board did authorize Superintendent Dr. Richard Gott to obtain a structural analysis on the building.

In other business, the Board:

•Approved a contract with Clear Image of Columbus to provide janitorial service at Rice High School at a cost of \$142,000 per year with present janitorial expenses and salaries going toward the new service;

•Heard a report by Rice Medical Center Administrator David Keith on the status of its assisted living center;

•Approved Project Graduation for Saturday, May 16;

•Adopted textbooks for the 1998-99 school year as recommended by the Textbook Committee;

•Approved the bid of Jaco Construction to replace the roof at Sheridan school for the sum of \$86,337;

•Approved ventilation improvements at the Garwood gym for \$16,740 and at Eagle Lake Middle School for \$18,277;

•Heard a report from Law Engineering that the light poles at the football field are structurally sound, but the replacement of crossbars and u-bolts is strongly recommended;

•Approved the Gifted and Talented Program presented by the GT Committee;

•Discussed the District's Career and Vocational Programs;

•Authorized Gott to obtain bids for 100 computers to be divided into four labs for ELMS, ELPS, Garwood and Sheridan;

•Set March 16, at 8 p.m. for a special meeting to consider professional personnel recommendations;

•Accepted the resignations of Kevin Whitfield at RHS at the end of the semester and Mabel Buford, effective March 16, at the Special Education Cooperative; and

•Employed Kam Dunham to teach math at RHS for 1998-99 and Cherry Weaver as a temporary employee at the Special Education Cooperative immediately.


