Sugar Land, with Rev. Lynn Bruce, Pastor, officiating.

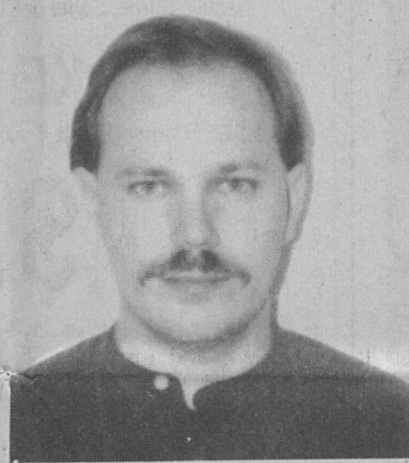
Interment will follow in Rose-mouth Cemetery in Clinton, South Carolina.

We would like to extend a warm welcome to Terry and Charles for joining the Basin Detox staff in Eagle Lake and becoming team players in "Our Family".



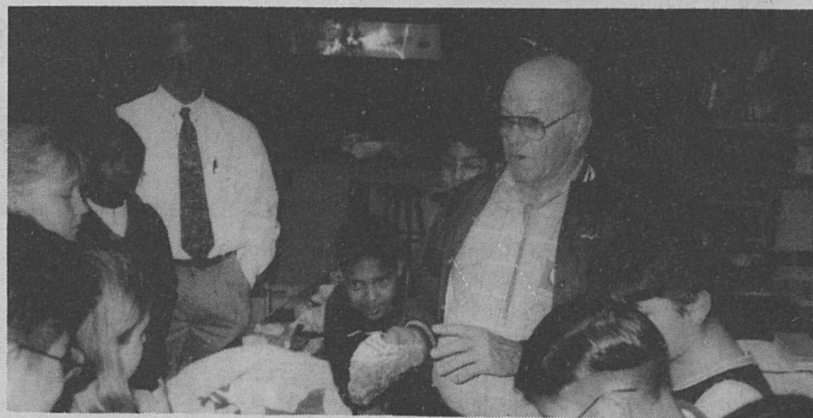
ELPS students dress western

ELMS teachers attend conference

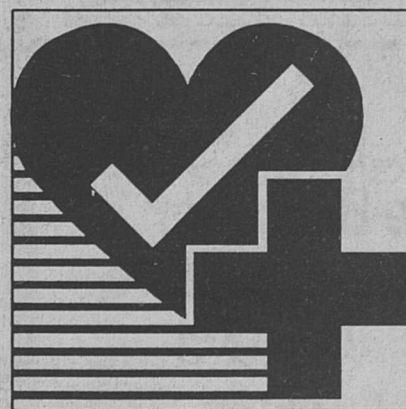
