

# Head Start expands services

Eagle Lake Head Start knows that, for young boy and girls, naps are as important as nutrition. Because of the success the program has had, it may soon expand to include infants and toddlers of parents with different priorities.

To find out which families need Head Start services most, workers will soon be gathering information either by going door to door or setting up

tables at community gathering places.

The goal is to gather information that will keep the Eagle Lake program in touch with the real needs of parents and their children.

"We might find out there is a need to serve teen parents or parents who have newborns," says Andreana Ledesma, director of recruiting at Centex Family Services Inc. which advertises in the Eagle Lake Head Start Center.
