Raider baseball team drops games

Tuesday, March 17, the Rice Raider baseball team took on the Schulenburg Shorthorns. Shorthorn pitcher Wotipka put one in the win column for Schulenburg with a score of 10-3. Klint Korenek was the losing pitcher for Rice. Kincheloe was 2 for 4.

Thursday, March 19, the Raiders got stomped by Yoakum 20-1. The winning pitcher was Sitka; losing pitcher was Klay Korenek. Brooks was 2 for 2 and Shanks had a homerun. Friday, March 20, the Raiders once again came up short against Round Top Carmine by the score of 9-

5. The losing pitcher was Klint Korenek; winning pitcher was Goebel. Klay Korenek was 2 for 3 with a home run; Thompson was also 2 for 3 and Kincheloe was 2 for 4. The Rice Raiders were in a nail-biter on Saturday, March 21, against Stockdale, losing by one run, 12-13. The winning pitcher was West; losing pitcher was Klay Korenek. Kincheloe was 2 for 4 and Klay Korenek 3 for 3 with a double. Errors continue to hamper the

Raiders, according to their coach. "We need to continue work on fundamentals," he stated. The Raiders have started eight different line-ups in eight ball games. "We are hoping to be more consistent this week. The hitting is starting to come around. Matt Ray had his best outing against Stockdale in a no decision," the coach said. Rice golfers gearing up for district this weekend

On March 17, the Raider boys golf team traveled to Hallettsville for the Brahma Golf Tournament. The Raiders entered two teams and finished sixth and eighth respectively out of a field of 17 teams. One Rice team consisted of Coy Sunderman with a 74; Jonathan Pope, 98; Chad Kallina, 94; John Rucka, 95; and Klint Korenek, 100. They shot a combined team score of 361 and finished sixth. Sunderman shot a 74 to finish as the second place medalist. The second Rice team consisted of Klay Korenek, 102; Jonathan Burrow, 92; Cliff Keith, 99; Kevin Hoffman,

95; and Cody Thompson, 115. They shot a combined 388 to finish in eighth place. "The boys played well in their first tournament," said Coach Ricky Gott. On March 24, the Raiders hosted the Rice Booster Club Invitational Golf Tournament. Both Rice teams played extremely well. One team consisted of Sunderman at 76; Kallina, 80; Pope, 80; Rucka, 86; and Burrow, 99. The team shot a combined 322 to take home the first place trophy. Sunderman was the first place individual medalist with a 76. The second Rice team consisted of

Klint Korenek with a 86; Keith, 86; Thompson, 92; Klay Korenek, 99; and Hoffman, 108. They shot a combined score of 364 to take home the third place trophy. Individual medalist scores for Rice were Isam Briscoe, 86; Joel Baggett, 109; and Justin Schneider, 110. The boys traveled to Flatonia on Monday in preparation for the district golf tournament to be played April 7 in Hempstead. Coach Gott says he is extremely proud of all the Rice golfers. He would like to thank the Eagle Lake Recreation Center, Rice Raider Booster Club, Laker Printing, Rice coaches, Pinto Brosche, Glen Sunderman and Ernie Sommerlatte for helping make this a successful tournament.
