LCRA awards \$25,000 to GVFD

The Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) awarded \$25,000 to the Garwood Volunteer Fire Department (GVFD) to upgrade its fire truck's water pumper on Tuesday,

The department's current pumper is 24 years old and does not meet the State Board of Insurance requirements that allow a community to receive credit for an organized fire department.

The GVFD provides emergency medical and fire services to about 1,800 rural residents in southern Colorado County and part of Wharton County.

The grant will help upgrade the pumper and meet the requirements, which will allow area homeowners and businesses the advantage of lower fire insurance premiums.

The grant was one of 33 grants given in March through LCRA's Community Development Partnership Program, now in its third year.

The program provides economic development and community assistance grants to cities, counties, volunteer fire departments, regional development councils and other nonprofit and other services it provides. organizations in LCRA's 58-county electric and water service area.
