Bush wants lawyers' fees ruling changed

Gov. George W. Bush last week asked a federal judge to throw out his previous ruling that declared lawyers' \$2.3 billion fee reasonable in the state's billion fee reasonable in the state's \$15.3 billion lawsuit against the tobacco industry.

Attorney General Dan Morales hired the team of private lawyers to represent the state in the lawsuit.

Lawyers for Bush and seven Republican and Democratic state legislators who joined the governor in suing to cut back the lawyers' fees (15% of the settlement) said they are prepared to appeal to a higher court if U.S District Judge David Folsom rules against them.

Austin lawyer Pete Schenkkan, who is representing Bush, said, "We think the law is clearly on our side, but in front of Judge Folsom.'

Gov. Bush Heads West

Gov. Bush traveled to California last week to raise money for his reelection campaign, speak to movie executives and attend a fundraiser for GOP gubernatorial candidate Dan Lungren.

Garry Mauro, Bush's Democratic challenger, chided the governor for doing the same thing he criticized his predecessor Ann Richards for doing in 1994: accepting campaign money from Californians and promoting the Texas film industry.

According to finance reports, Bush has raised about \$8 million for his re-election, including \$1.2 million from out of state.
