The possibility of the City being able to house an ambulance and fire truck at the hospital area when the facility is completed is being discussed with Rice Medical Center.

Council adopted the revised ordinance requiring permits for all commercial trucks to operate on City streets and the elimination of parking or standing of any commercial truck (that comes under the class of a commercial truck), including rice trucks, on a City street, alley or shoulder.

A commercial vehicle is defined as any single vehicle which is selfpropelled and the operator is required by state law to have a commercial driver's license, or any size vehicle which requires hazardous materials placards whether loaded or unloaded.

All designated truck routes have

oeen eliminated. The only designated truck routes are those within the City that are maintained by the state or county, and have a county, state or federal route identification number or designation. No city streets may be used without a


