### Marine Pfc. Alfred J. Estrada

...son of Alfredo and Dolores Estrada of Sheridan, recently completed basic training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego.

Estrada successfully completed 12 weeks of training designed to challenge new Marine recruits both physically and mentally.

Estrada and fellow recruits began their training at 5 a.m., by running

three miles and performing calisthenics. In addition to the physical conditioning program, Estrada spent numerous hours in classroom and field assignments. They performed close order drill and operated as a small infantry unit during field training.

Estrada and other recruits also received instruction on the Marine Corps' core values - honor, courage and commitment, and what the words mean in guiding personal and professional conduct.

Estrada and fellow recruits ended the training phase with The Crucible, a 54-hour team effort, problem solving evolution which culminated with an emotional ceremony in which the recruits were presented the Marine Corps Emblem and were addressed as "Marines" for the first time since boot camp began.

Estrada joins 41,000 men and women who will enter the Marine Corps this year from all over the country.

He is a graduate of Glencoe-Silver Lake High School of Glencoe, Minn.

### Wemhaner, Taylor to wed

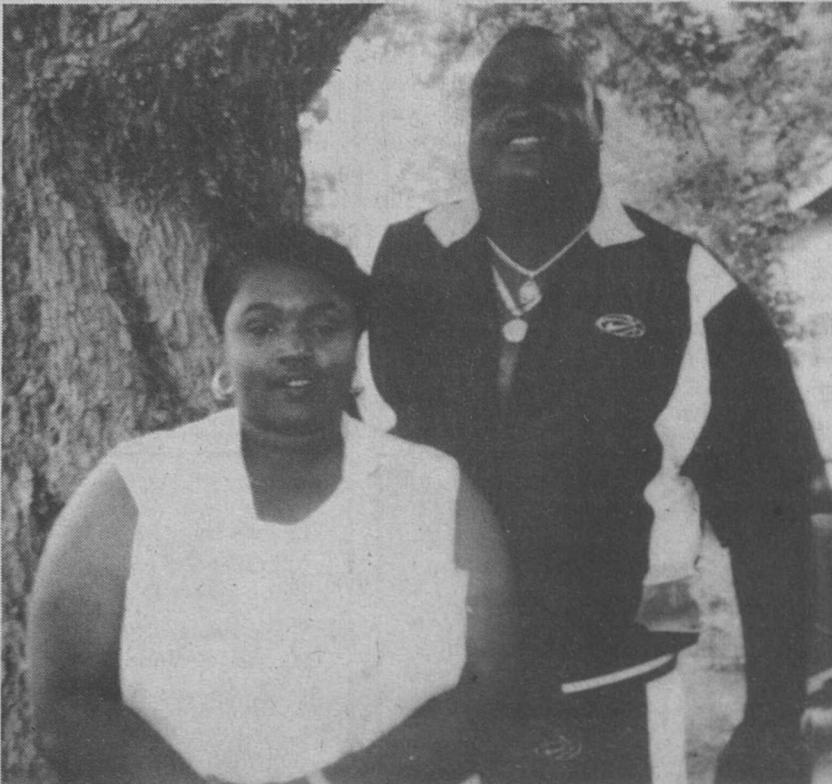

### LAMINATE VENEERS

When someone says, "cheese," and takes your photo, do you keep your lips zipped? If you hate to smile because your teeth are cracked, chipped or discolored, take heart. There is a new technique that can help make your smile picture perfect - laminate veneer. In concept, laminate veneers are similar to false fingernails. A very thin layer of porcelain is bonded to the outside surface of the teeth to improve appearance. Teeth can be lengthened, widened or in most cases lightened for improved esthetics. In many cases, some tooth enamel must be removed, but this rarely causes any problems for

healthy teeth. Laminate veneers usually require more than one visit to the dentist. They last many years and will have better color stability and strength than conventional bonding. Laminate veneers are a more conservative option than the traditional method of capping teeth with crowns, which requires the removal of part of the tooth.
