MOTHERS LINKED TO DECAY

Research with human DNA has shown that mothers with poor dental hygiene can pass cavity-causing bacteria on to their infants. Transmission of the bacteria can lead to dental problems by the time infants break in their first teeth. In short, when parents practice good oral hygiene, their children often develop fewer cavities.

Mothers, who typically have the most contact with babies, are identified as the transmitter of dental cavity bacteria. The practice of blowing on babies' food or thermal taste testing may be the most common cause of bacteria transmission, researchers

The study, which was carried out in Sweden, showed that by the time children reached the age of three, only 20% in the group of mothers with good dental habits were infected with bacteria. Of the group of mothers with high numbers of bacteria who did not practice good dental hygiene, over 60% of the children had harmful bacteria. There's a message here for new mothers.
