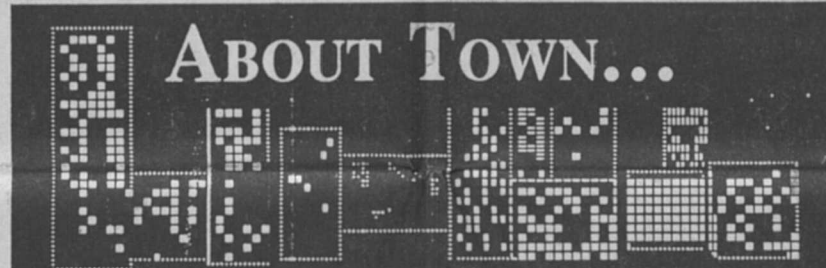
Espanol los cuales brindan en cada pagina desde un consejo, frases motivacionales, y hasta buenos modales para la vida diaria.
