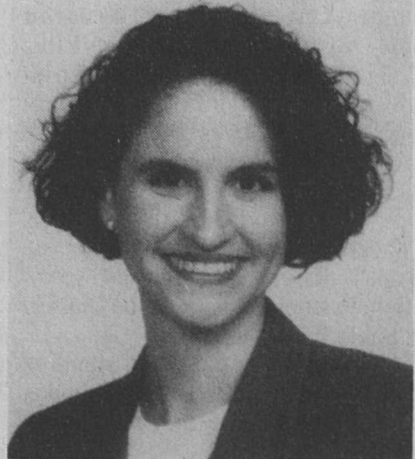
The commencement ceremonies were held at the Jesse H. Jones Hall for the Performing Arts in downtown Houston.
