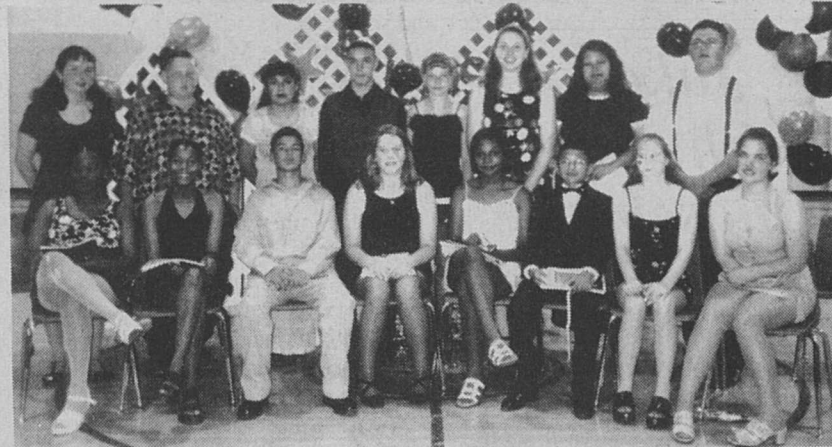

Rice Consolidated ISD releases dress code

Through the years, a very favorable and positive image has been created by the behavior and appearance of the student body in the Rice CISD. Our District continues to believe in the importance of encouraging high standards in dress and personal grooming.

The District's dress code is established to teach hygiene, instill discipline, prevent disruption, avoid safety hazards and assert authority.

Students shall come to school looking clean and neat and shall wear clothing and exhibit grooming that will not be a health or safety hazard to themselves or others. The District prohibits any clothing or grooming that in the principal's judgement may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or interference with normal school operations.

Basic consideration in the guidelines shall be given to: dangers to the student's health and safety, interference with school work, disruption to orderly school processes, and damage to school property.

1. Clothing must be neat and clean in appearance and appropriate to the gender of the student; for example, boys may not wear earrings.

2. Vulgar or obscene patches, and suggestive lettering or insignia or organizational products referring to alcohol, tobacco, drugs, sex, weapons, or gang-related paraphernalia or gang colors are not permitted.

3. All students must wear appropriate shoes designed for outdoor use. Thongs, house shoes and beach-type sandals are prohibited.

4. Hats, caps, head bands, bandanas, chains and hip cloths are not acceptable and are not allowed to be worn in the building at anytime. Rakes, picks and grooming combs may not be worn in hair.

5. Clothing must not be too loose, saggy or oversized. (Examples of this type of clothing are: JNCO and Boss) the waistband of pants, shorts and skirts must be worn at the waist. Shirts and tops must be tucked in or should

not be longer than the top of the back pocket opening. Pant legs should not drag on the floor. Overall straps are to be correctly hooked. Clothing may not be too tight for free movement, comfortable sitting, reaching or bending positions. Belts must be worn when the pants have belt loops.

6. Hair must be kept clean, neat and trimmed to a moderate length. Sideburns must be kept trimmed and no longer than the bottom of the earlobe. All other facial hair must be shaved. Boys' hair may not extend below the dress shirt collar or be bound in any manner.

7. **BOYS:** Only the first button may be unbuttoned. Shirts must have sleeves and cover the entire torso when arms are raised above the head. Muscle shirts and tank-tops, mesh knit shirts or extra thin clothing are not acceptable. **GIRLS:** Only the first button may be unbuttoned. Midriffs, crop tops, tank tops, low cut tops and spaghetti straps are not permitted. The entire torso must be covered when arms are raised above the head. A complete compliment of foundation garments must be worn at all times. Mesh knit shirts or extra thin clothing are not allowed. Sleeveless shirts are permitted if the shoulders are covered and shirt sides go up to the armpit.

8. The length of shorts, skirts, and dresses should be no shorter than the bottom of the longest fingertips when the student is standing with arms extended. Cut-offs, spandex, pajamas and lounge-type outfits are not permitted.

NOTE: Exceptions to these rules may be left to the discretion of the building principal in unusual situations. The principal, in conjunction with the sponsor, coach or other person in charge of an extra-curricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity. The interpretation on dress code made by the campus principal will be considered final.
