When premenopausal women have strokes, they have a lower risk of brain damage as compared to men who are the same age. A report in the medical journal Stroke suggests that it is the estrogen in women's blood that may protect them against brain damage due to stroke. Researchers at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine studied the effects of stroke in female laboratory animals that had high estrogen levels and low estrogen levels due to removal of the ovaries. They also studied the effects of stroke in male laboratory animals who had low estrogen levels. The females with low estrogen levels had about the same amount of brain damage after stroke as did the males. The females with high estrogen levels were protected against stroke.

Estrogens are often prescribed for women at the time popular to help prevent osteoporosis and to reduce annoying symptimus tuch as hot flashes. It is not known whether or not giving estrogen to male or female human stroke victims would help protect them against stroke damage. provide a rationale for the use of estrogen to improve stroke outcome in postmenopausal women.
