From 4:30 to 6:30, the cheerleaders were hard at work on banners and locker decorations for football and volleyball season.

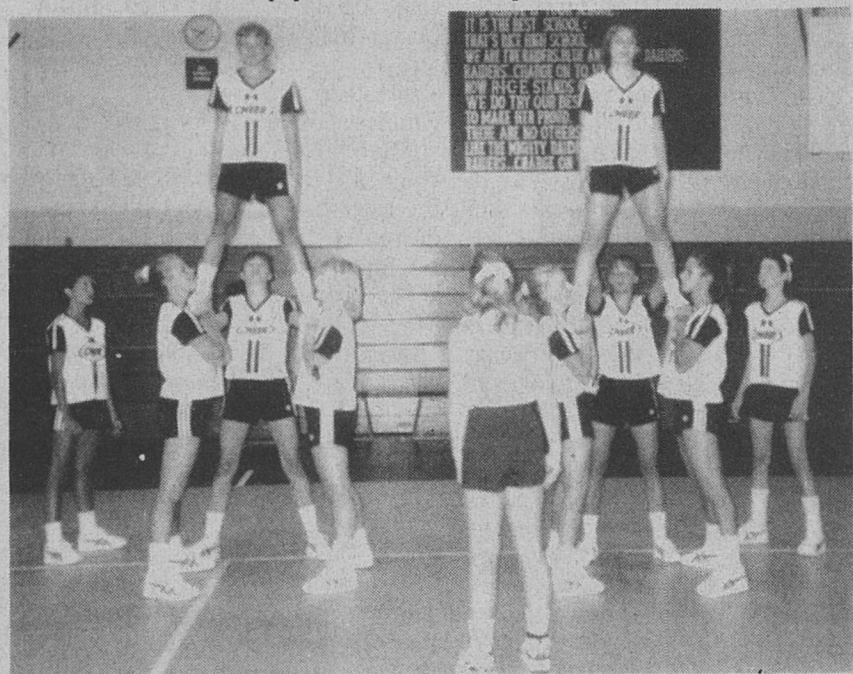
During the camp, each squad earned one excellent and five superior ribbons.
