### THE TROUBLE WITH FEMALE FEET

## Views On Dental Health

### STRAIGHTER SMILES

If you think you see a lot of teenagers wearing braces, you are only seeing a fraction of those who should be having orthodontic care. Actually some 90% of American children ages 12 to 17 could use orthodontic treatment (the correction of misaligned teeth).

It is recommended that a child have his or her first orthodontic exam at the age of 7 and then be checked periodically, until all the permanent teeth have erupted and much of the jaw growth has been completed before applying braces (if needed).

If braces are recommended, here

are some facts to consider: The average time a child has braces is two years. In general, girls mature faster than boys, so they may be ready earlier. Frequent and meticulous brushing with a fluoride toothpaste will prevent white patches under braces (an early sign of decay). It is important to avoid sticky foods, such as caramels, which can loosen bands and brackets, break archwires and promote decay.

The Garwood School presented awards to the top reader in each class. Students read books and took a test on the books they read.

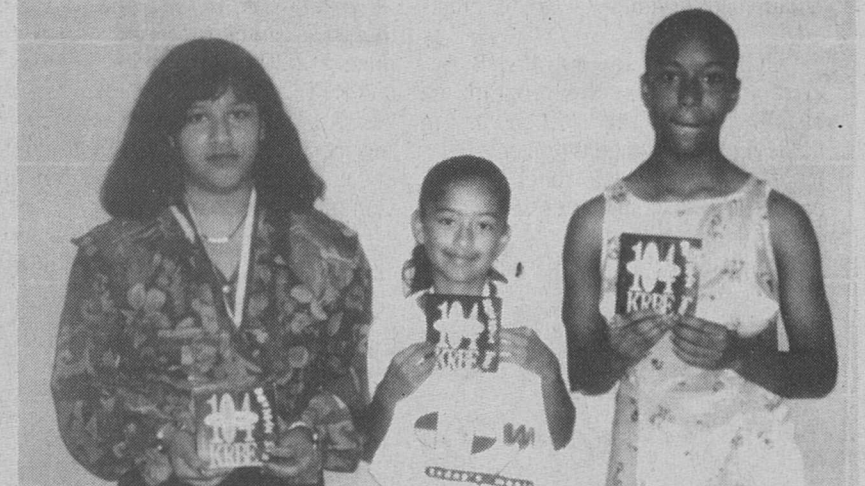
In the Accelerated Reader program books are worth anywhere from

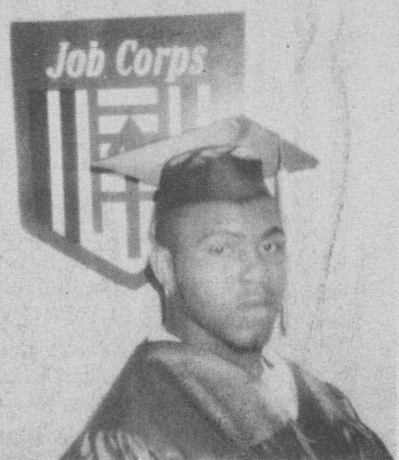
Shropshire joined the Gary Job Corps in June 1997.
