DOES FLOSSING WORK?

Flossing may be a new subject for many persons. Most people seem to believe that a good brushing is sufficient, just as they may believe that a sixmonth checkup can prevent cavities. As most adults (who display their dentist's handiwork when they open their mouths) can attest, cavities still appear even though the teeth are brushed and a dentist is seen on a

One of the best solutions to a persistent cavity problem is to floss. Here's why: Even the best brush cannot completely remove plaque BETWEEN the teeth and beneath the gumline. Regular

flossing does remove plaque and debris from between the teeth and below the gumline - areas where decay often starts.

Those of you who think your teeth do not require flossing should test your teeth for plaque by purchasing a "disclosing agent". After placing the disclosing agent on the teeth, the plaque will be stained a bright red. This reveals where brushing is not adequate.

relieve headache pain can actually make their headaches worse. This is

sometimes referred to as "drug rebound headache." The idea of a drug

worsening a condition that it is supposed to treat is not new. Physicians

have known for years that narcotic and nonnarcotic pain relievers (includ-

ing nonsteroidal antiinflammatory drugs such as aspirin and ibuprofen)

and prescription migraine headache medicines referred to as the triptans

can cause rebound headache pain. According to an international workshop

devoted to this problem, several things must be present for a true rebound headache to occur. For example, there must be more than 20 head-

aches per month. The headache must last for at least 10 hours. Medicines

used to relieve the pain must have been taken for more than 20 days of the

month. And the headache must increase in severity when one or more

3 times a week at most. The amount of pain reliever used should be low.

A non-drug approach (for example, stress reduction, limiting caffeine

intake, and getting plenty of rest) may be beneficial.

Physicians who treat drug rebound headaches offer suggestions as to how to prevent this situation. Medicine use should be limited to 2 to
